General AMHERST, we hear, intended to gots Land George, white he whole Army; as reflectary. P H I L A D E L P H I A, July 12.

At a Court of Admiralty, held here last Week, the four Prizes, lately brought in by the Britannia Privateer, Capt. M Pherson, were all condemped.

Extrall of a Letter from Boston, June 25, 1759.
" A Vessel is just arrived here in 8 Days from Louisburg, by which we learn, that a French Schooner was fent in there, taken by Admiral Durell's Squadron, within 15 Leagues of Quebet. The Schooner was bound down the River, and informed the Admiral that two French Ships of the Line, three Frigates, and thirteen or fifteen Transports, had got up to Quebec, and others were daily expected; but we hope our Fleets will prevent them.

We have Advice from Albany, that two Families were lately cut off, within five or fix Miles of Sir William Johnson's:

Extrad of a Letter from Pittsburgh, June 26, 1759.
"There lately arrived here two Indian Mes. fengers from Chineffe, -2 Town of the Sencea Nation, with a Message to all the Tribes settled on the Ohio, acquainting them, that the Six Nations had taken, near that Place, Joncobr, the samous French Interpreter, with another Officer, and killed a Third; whole Scalp, with the two French Officers, and fome Brench Soldiers, they had fent to Sir William Johnson:

Extrast of another Letter from the fame Place, dales the First Instant.

". The Convoy is arrived fafe, which would have been attacked by a large Body of French and Ihdians, if they had been one Day longer on their March. Upwards of 400 Indians, of different Nations, have been lately at this Fort, and were all cloathed. The Beaver Chief, with several other Chiefs, of fundry Tribes, and their Atten-

dants, are expected."

ANNAPOLIS, July 19.

We hear that on Wednesday last Week a Party of French and Indians made a sudden Attack upon Loyal Harmon, killed Three of the Rojal American, and carried off Two Prisoners. On Thursday they attacked Stony-Creek, and killed Capt. Jones of the Pennsylvanians, Three Privates, and one Woman, who were looking over the Redoubt; and would in all Likelihood have carried that Poff, had not Four Hundred of the Royal Amorican wery fortunately enter d it about an Hour before. On Friday, they, made an Attempt upon Rays-Town, and killed Three or Four there: At which last Place a Field Officer's Guard is kept, as they exped another Visit from them. Tis faid that by Advices from Pittfourg, this Party confifs of Three Hundred Indians and Sixty Fresch of whom we hope from to have a more agreeable Account.
