Jan. 13. The Charming Polly, bound for Virginia to London, is taken, and carried into Maloes.

The Polly, alias Bartholomew, bound for Maryland to London, is taken by a privateer, and carried into St. Maloes.

Jan. 15. It is said Lord Villiers, Parliament for Weobly, in Herefordshire, eldest Son to Lord Jersey, will succeed Admiral Boscawen, as one of the Admiralty; and that Admiral Pocock will take upon him the Command of the Sea.

Part of a Letter from the Hague, Jan. 13. The greatest Part of the English Fleet have arrived within these few Days from their Way to England, complaining since F—, that he aims at nothing but Honour to himself, and filling his Pocket with Money.

The Newcastle, Spencer, and the others, both from Maryland to London, and carried into Bayonne.

Jan. 17. Yesterday Major General Hodgson kissed his Majesty's Hand on his being appointed Second in Command in Chief of the Fleet, on a secret Expedition. As did also Lord, on his being appointed Second in Command.
