The Polacco was called the Victore, Joseph Berest, Commander, richly laden with Indigo, Sugar, &c.—Captain Emerson, and his People (except five) were put on board Captain Cotton's Vessel, and arrived at Plymouth about ten Days since.

On Monday last arrived here Capt. John Andrews, in the Brig Catharine, from the West-Indies, and informs, that on the 11th ult. in Lat. 24: 30, Long. 71, he was taken by a French Privateer from the Cape, commanded by Martin Arnauld, with about 20 Men, and some Cannon and Swivels.
