Resolv'd, Nemine Contradicente,

THAT the Thanks of this House be given to Mr. Speaker, for his constant Attendance in the Chair, of above Thirty-three Years, and ready Impartiality of his Advice, and for the indefatigable Pains he has, with his Honourable Associates, constantly taken to promote the Interest of the King and Country, to maintain the Honour of the Parliament, and to preserve inviolable the Rights of the Commons of Great-Britain.

Upon which Mr. Speaker said,
WAS never under so great a Difficulty in what to say in this Place, as I am at this Occasion, of Thanks and Gratitude. I am sensible of the many Favours which I have receiv'd from the House, and I am sure I now receive the same; the most that any Man can receive for his Services, as to the House itself, who made me in me.

When I began my Duty here, I set out with a great Respect to every Body. The first I know of is the only Merit I can assume: If I have sav'd the House from any Misfortune, it was unwillingly; I can truly say, the giving Satisfaction to all my Friends, my Study, and my Pride.

And now, Sirs, I am to take my last Leave of this House, and I am sensible of the great Pleasure of my Life: But my Duty obliges me to take my Leave, and I shall only have Power to hope and to pray, that my daily Prayer, will be for the Continuance in general, and that the Freedom, Authority of this House, may be perpetual.
