B E R L I N, April

THE Court hath published the count of an Action on the 2d of April, between a Body of Major-Generals *Schenckendorff* and a Body of Austrians, and of the Empire.

On the first of April, Major-General *Sybourg* with his Troops from *Gera*, where he had his Winter-Quarters, and the same Day advanced towards the *Otla*. Being joined there by the Major-General *Sybourg*, he proceeded, on the 2d, where his Vanguard, composed of *Zethen's* Hussars, commanded by Major *Horn*, the Heights behind the Village of *Gornsdorf*, and Troops of the Empire under Major-General *Sybourg*, were saluted by a brisk Discharge of the brave Major *Horn*; did not retreat; he climbed up the Heights with two Troops, and whilst the three others fled off the Heights, he broke their Infantry, made great Numbers of Prisoners, and took four Pieces of Cannon, twelve Pounds, and several Colours. Twenty Officers, and 300 Men were on this Occasion made Prisoners.

On the other Hand, Major *Prittowitz*, who was Major-General *Sybourg's* Brigade, and who had been ordered to attack the Village of *Schwarte*, who made vain Efforts to retake the Post. The Battalion of *Loffow*, which was the Independent Battalion, carrying the Troops to the Heights beyond the Village, pointed out the 5th Discharge the Enemy at an important Post; which Major *Prittowitz* perceived the *Rivulet* of *Schwarz* with his Hussars, took three Colours, the same Number of Prisoners, and made one whole Battalion Prisoners.

This Affair, the Honour of which chiefly fell to the Share of the *Hussars*, cost the Enemy seven Pieces of Cannon, five covered Waggonns with Powder, and several Waggonns, among which were those of Major-General *Sybourg*. We also took 32 Officers, of which *Nutzel*, 2 Majors, and 8 Captains, and 1100 Men. *Dresden*, April 2. The King of *Prussia's* Army, who had been ordered to attack the *Prussians*, intended to stay in it all the Summer.

Hagen, April 21. We hear that the Troops of the *Prussians* have gained another Advantage over the *Empire*. On the 6th Instant a Detachment of the *Prussians* attacked the Corps under General *Sturmer*, in the *Voigtland*, took one Colonel, 8 Officers, and about 150 Men, and 4 Pieces of Cannon, and several Colours. The *Prussians* lost, on this Occasion, 2 Officers, a Lieutenant, and 100 Men.

L O N D O N, April 16.

Yesterday Morning Major-General *Douglas* departed, in order to embark a large Body of *Prussians*, in order to embark a large Body of *Prussians*.

By a Letter from the East-Indies, by Way of *Amoy*, there is Advice, that the Crew of the *Deer*, after having burnt her, retired into *Fort M*, and defended the Place with great Bravery; but were forced to surrender, and were obliged to surrender to the *Prussians*, who were so fortunate as to have removed great Numbers of the *Prussians*, and some of the *Prussians* were sent to *Batavia*.

The *Bristol Packet*, *Bartlett*, is arrived at *Batavia* in 28 Days.

The *Armament* fitted out under the Command of *Commodore Keppel*, in respect to Land Forces, that has been out this War.

We hear the French Frigate lately taken by *Capt. Bregrave*, is 24 Feet longer, a masted Frigate, and is capable of making 12 Knots per Hour for his Majesty's Service.—It reflects the Honour in general, and on our Sea Officers in particular, when we see the Enemy afraid to engage with an inferior Force, and throwing their Guns, and attempting to land their Men on *Batavia*, and the shore stuck full of sharp Iron Spikes; and the *Prussians* sinking the flat-bottomed Boats being sent to *Batavia*, were so fast upon the Spikes, that they were forced off; which the French perceiving, and

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
