CADIZ, April 13.
THE Squadron which the King had ordered to be equipped in our last Tuesday with a fair wind, consists of six Ships of the Line, a Flute laden with Cannon, and is bound to the Havannah; but the Ships is to part from it in a certain Latitude, to proceed to Vera Cruz, whither the quantity of Quick Silver, which he wanted in that Colony.

For two or three Weeks past a Gang has infested this Place; they are masked, armed; they enter People's Houses in the night, and murder those who make any Resistance; they carry off every thing that is not too heavy. These Miscreants very lately broke open the House of a rich Merchant, who was at Supper with his Friends, and his Wife and Child were murdered Part of the Company and looted the Cellar; after which they fat out the least Concern by the dead Body, drank up several Bottles of Wine; they broke up the House, and made off. The Punishment which is sometimes the only one they use, being a sufficient Check to the Commission of Crimes. We shall soon have all our public Houses infested by other Vagabonds, Bohemians, here by the Name of Gitanos, who were banished from the Kingdom by the late King, but are now returning from the Island of Ferment, where they had taken Refuge.

LONDON, May
The Lord Anson Transport, lying off *Houset*, Deptford, which was formerly the Centaur Man of War, the last of six last built, is ordered to sail forthwith for *Porto Rico*, to receive the Troops on board, and join the *Three Martinico* Ships, and three French Ships, are taken.

The French Ambassador at *Stockholm* presented to the Diet a Memorial, wherein he desired a great Parade of the fine Dispositions of the King's Arms, for putting an End to the present War, but at the same Time sets forth, "How difficult it is, in Circumstances so important, to the Swedish Army, and to put it in a State of Operations efficaciously, as the only way of advancing the Negotiations at the interposition of the King's Arms."

There has been a desperate Engagement at *Malta*, between six Maltese Vessels of Tripoli, wherein two of the largest, and one, of 20 Guns, taken.

May 9. They write from *Hamburg* that the 21st ult. a Prussian Detachment came to a Contribution of 80,000 Crowns from the County of *Jeffer*, situated in the County of *Oldenburg*, belonging to the Prince of *Anhalt-Zerbst*, of which was immediately sent to the King of *Denmark*, to whom *Oldenburg* belongs.

They write from *Vienna* of the 18th ult. that they had a certain Account, that *General Mordaunt* had an Army of 35,000 Men under his Command in *Silesia*; and that 30,000 Russians were ordered to join him, after which they would be able to face the King of *Prussia*.

An Order is sent from the Lords of the Treasury to the Officers of the Mint, to coin 100,000 Pieces of Gold, on a Dye of his Majesty's.

Mr. de Bussey, first Clerk of the Department of Foreign Affairs, is expected here from *Paris* to execute a Commission previous to the Meeting of the Congress.

All the general Officers, and others, who were ordered to set out the first of this Month for their Corps in *Germany*.
