Albo, the Sloop *lovely Jane*, bound to Madeira from Bermuda, but was taken the Fifth Instant, in Lat. 33, Long. 63, by a French Privateer Brig of 300 Men, which had also taken the *lovely Jane*, viz. A Sloop from Madeira to Virginia; The Snow *Lairn*, Captain *Well*, from Liverpool, and the Snow *Nancy*, Captain *Graham*, from Bristol, both for this Port; a Sloop from Maryland for Jamaica, *ransomed*; a Sloop from Virginia to Antigua; A Schooner from Virginia; and a Sloop from Rhode-Island for Nam. — Captain Albo left the Privateer at 38: 30, Long 55, the 14th Instant, and about Fifty of the People from the different Sloops with him. — The Sloop fell in with a Frigate built Letter of Marque Ship, of good build, from Jamaica, the Captain of which being informed with what had happened, and the Snow being then, it is said, in Sight, the Captain *Graham* and his Hands (15) on the Vessel, and bore away, to endeavour to save her.
