Colonel brought back to the Camp 84 Prisoners, and Horses. [London Gazette.]

Hamburg, May 21. We are in a very uncertain Situation. If we favour one Side, we are threatened and the most steady and uniform Conduct can be from Threats of Retribution by one or other of engaged in the War; and what adds to our Misfortune that we know not where it will end. We are daily flattered with Hopes of Peace, but fear that deceives us: Every Appearance around us carries War; and it is probable that this Campaign will bloody one we have yet seen. The Powers have indeed appointed a Congress to be held; all view that such Proposals have actually been made; but the Accounts to be settled are so intricate that it will be difficult to adjust them.

London, May 12. Marshal Broglio and the Austrian have received all their Reinforcements amount to upwards of 14000 Men. Prussia does not exceed 60,000; so that, as there is proportion in Point of Numbers, it is imagined will keep mostly on the Defensive this Campaign.

L O N D O N, May 26.

Letter from a Gentleman in the Expedition against his Friend, dated May 11.

"Amidst the confused Noise of a Siege, of the Shot, the Burbling of Shells, the Volleys of the Drums and Fifes, &c. &c. I have selected the unity of telling you, I am well, though fatigued to Death. The Island is all our own, except the Palais, a d--d strong Fortification. Our force was repulsed with the Loss of 460 Men, killed and taken Prisoners; our second was effected with Loss. Skirmishes have frequently happened since with some Loss of Men, though we always Point; a Fortnight more, and we hope to see Jack flying on the lofty Battlements of this Gibraltar. We expect the French Fleet hourly, consisting of Ships of the Line: Let them come, and we'll give some Reception Monsieur Constant met with almost every Place. Adieu, I am now summoned, &c."

Ten Transports, with Troops on board for Brest sailed from Spithead.

Extract of a Letter from Portsmouth, May 11. On Wednesday arrived at Spithead, the Hampton Court Men of War, with 25 Transport Carroy from Belleisle. We hear our Forces have 30 Yards of the Citadel.

"At Spithead, Admiral Geary, with Twelve War."

We are assured, by Letters from Plymouth, Robert Manners's Regiment embarked there last Morning, for Belleisle.

Since the English have been on Belleisle, the French has received only one Letter, which the French meant to convey by a single Person in the Night, Boat.

The Allied Army was ready for Action the 12th Letters from Nantz (after representing Belleisle) say, that they are under great Apprehensions in as they imagine that the English intend to fortify in Belleisle, and make it a Place of Arms; and attack Port L'Orient, or some other Place on the Yesterday Forty-five large Transports were taken the Government's Service.

We hear that the Men of War at Portsmouth for a second Expedition, will be ready to sail the End of this Month.

It is computed, that since the French have been Fishing upon the Banks of Newfoundland, the French Fishery hath increased to the Subjects of Great near a Million and an Half Sterling.
