Art. I. There shall be no Hostilities from henceforth between Prussian Troops every where and the other.

Art. II. The Suspension of Troops commanded by Prussian Forces, shall consist of these Presents, and with Corps in Poland and Silesia from the Day of the Armistice, which, after Signing this dispatched with an Account Orders already given for the Russian Majesty.

Art. III. During this Armistice the Limits between the Prussia, and the New Marches, shall pass. Notwithstanding the Garrison of Stettin, Culture their Patroles to the Village Barenbruck, Buckholtz, situated on the other Side to Wartha, but no further ever. Nor shall the Russians go beyond their Villages.
