

THE Managers of the Subscription for making the River Patowmack Navigable for Small Craft, from *Willis-Creek* to the *Great-Falls*, have Resolved to postpone their Meeting at *Frederick-Town* to the 26th Day of *July* next. It appeared necessary to prolong the Time for several Reasons: First, Some of the Gentlemen who had determined to assist in making an accurate Survey of the River, in marking and pointing out the necessary Work to be done, and in calculating (upon the Spot) the Expence of every particular Undertaking, cannot possibly attend so soon as the Time mentioned in their first Address to the Public: In the next Place, After more mature Deliberation, the Month of *May* was thought too early, as the River is generally high at that Season, besides its being more liable to be swelled by the Rains then, than in the Months of *June* and *July*, when the Waters are not only for the most part low, but may reasonably be expected to continue in a settled equal State for some Time together, a Circumstance, without which it would be difficult to survey and examine the River with the necessary Accuracy: Add to these, The Opposition the Design met with from a Gentleman who alarmed the Public, by placing in their View a Crowd of Difficulties, which existed only in his Description, by confounding vast Designs, which would improve Nations to effect, with a Work, which, tho' of the greatest Use and Importance to the Public, may yet be effected at a very moderate Expence: In a Word, by writing with great Ingenuity upon a Subject he had not well considered. The Managers have now the Pleasure to inform the Public, that Subscriptions are filling very fast, and that People in general, but more especially in the Back Counties, and those bordering upon *Potowmack*, discover so much Alacrity in promoting the Affair, that there is not the least Doubt but a Sum will be raised, sufficient to carry on the Work by the Day now appointed for their Meeting. Fully satisfied of this, they take the present Opportunity to desire such as are inclinable to become Undertakers, to be very particular in their Examination of every Part of the River, to calculate the necessary Expence as they proceed, to inform themselves of every Difficulty, and how to remove it; and when thus prepared, to meet the Managers at *Frederick-Town* in *Maryland*, on the 26th Day of *July*, as before mentioned, that their Observations may be compared with those in the Hands of the Managers, in order to prevent further Delays, and that they may be enabled on both Sides to enter into Contracts without Danger of Confusion or Imposition; and those who shall then appear to have been assiduous and exact in their Enquiries, may depend upon receiving a suitable Recompense.
