Kelly, of Rhode-Island, who went into the Harbour of St. John's with his Vessel, after the Place was taken, as formerly mentioned;—Captain John Johnson, of New-York, and Mr. John Lewis, of London: These Gentlemen were taken in the Ship Sally, on her Voyage from London to New-York, having a very valuable Cargo on board; she was taken in Lat. 48. Long. 56. by the above-mentioned Captain Storslip; the Commodore would have reform'd the Vessel, had not the Irish Captain persuaded him from it: When they got Possession of the Sally, they had not Seasonable to navigate her; and the Portcoons, after opening the Hatch, and breaking up some of the Boxes of Goods, destroyed her.—Captain Heaton was also taken in the same Latitude; he was in the Sloop Dolphin, bound from Dartmouth to Newfoundland, was taken out of his Vessel, and carried on board the Commodore's Ship.
Monday last arrived here the Captain Phillips and *Mercator* in 10 Days from Halifax, by whom we learn, that the Right Hon. Lord Colville, in His Majesty's Ship Northumberland of 70 Guns, together with the *Garbort* of 40, and the *Princess* Ship King George of 50 Guns, sailed from Halifax on the 27th Day, with the same Vessels, for Placentia in Newfoundland, in consequence of His Majesty's Ships Annulet of 50 Guns and *Seigneur* of 27, from whence it is conjectured they proceeded to St. John's, in order to Block up the French Ships in that Harbour.
