

NEW-YORK, September 27
Friday Morning last the Pitt Packet Boat, Capt. Goddard, sailed with the Mail for Falmouth.

Saturday last came to Town John Huffy, an Inhabitant of this Place, and one late belonging to Captain Thodey's Company of Provincials, who sailed from New-York in June last for the Havannah, in the second Division of Transports. He is one of those who were taken on board the five Transports by the French Men of War, on the 21st of July last, and informs, That the Night following two of the Transports, the Nathaniel and John, and the Britannia, were lost on the Coast of Maguana, together with one of the French Frigates: That the Crews of each Vessel, as well as the Soldiers, got safe to the Island, and remained there 3 Days before they were taken on board by the French Men of War, when they were carried to Cape-Francois, where they arrived the 21st of July, and the Sick sent directly to the Hospital, whilst those in Health were kept on board, and distributed among the Men of War in the Harbour. That those sent to the Hospital were used but very indifferently: That he Huffy was obliged to make his Escape in his Shirt down to the Sea, where he luckily met a Flag-Brig, bound to New-London, and got on board her. That on the 21st of August the Brig left the Cape, in Company with 19 other Vessels, some bound to France, others to St. Lucia, &c. &c. but that on the 23rd the Fleet was met with by the Privateers New Grace, Capt. Taylor, of Philadelphia, and the Speedwell, Capt. Kemp, of New-Providence, when they took one Flag-Sloop, the French Brig that is arrived at Philadelphia, and the New-London Brig: That those Men belonging to the Regulars which were taken, being the best Part of eight Companies of the 5th Regiment, as also such of Capt. Thodey's as were in Health, were on board the Men of War, designed to be carried to France; And that the French offered some Hundred Dollars to the English to enter on board to work home the Vessels, one Half of which Sum would be paid down.

Mr. Huffy continues his Information by saying, That there were at the Cape one Ship of 80, two of 60, and one of 40 Guns, besides two Frigates, which were near loaded with Sugars, &c. and designed soon to depart for France, with a large Convoy; That the French Merchants appeared very uneasy, when they heard of the Progress the English made against the Havannah, saying, they did not expect to hold their Possessions above a Month, as the British Forces, they thought, were desired next against them.

PHILADELPHIA, September 20.
Tuesday arrived here the Prize Sloop American, late Capt. Baretton; she was bound from Cape-Francois to Corocoa, her Lading Sugar and Coffee. She was taken by the Privateer HERO, Captain APPOWEN, of this Port; as was likewise, at the same Time, the Sloop Young Samuel, Nicholas Dirkes Commander, bound also to Corocoa, from the Cape, and her Cargoe, we hear, the same as the above. There was a third Sloop in Company, which the Hero had sent in pursuit of. Captain Appowen has likewise taken a Brig from Hispaniola, laden with Molasses, and sent her to Providence.

Arrived at Antigua. Captain Anderson, from Virginia; Captains Davis and Webb, from Maryland; and Capt. Robeson, from this Port.

ANNAPOLIS, October 7.
It is said our Provincial Court will break up this Day.

To-morrow is fixed for the Execution of Michael Peck, in Frederick County, for Murder; and of Thomas Cooper, here, for Burglary.

Thursday last, all the Prisoners who had broke out of our Goal a few Nights before, were taken, and re-committed.

We hear that a Special Court will soon be appointed for the Trial of some Felons, now in our Goal, for Felonies discovered since the Discharge of the Provincial Grand-Jury.

On Monday last, as Two white Men, One Negro, and a Boy, who belong'd to the Baltimore, were rowing off to the Ship, just without the Dock, a Quarrel happen'd between one of the white Men and the Negro, and in the Tuffle they both fell over-board, and were Drowned.
