

which weighed the exact Weight of the Silver. This, with the Gold found before, makes the Prize about 20,000 l more valuable; and they have not yet examined above one Half, so in all probability they may find more.

An Account is received that the Ferrol Squadron is fitted, with Troops on board, supposed for Newfoundland, and that Admiral Hawke was failed after them.

The King George Packet-Boat, Captain Brown, is arrived at Falmouth from Lisbon, in 17 Days. She brings Letters from Lisbon, dated the 31st ult. which advise, that the Marquis de Marealvo, with the several Portuguese Regiments, had marched towards the Borders, the Spaniards upon the Frontiers retreated with great Precipitation from Villa Real, so that the Province of Minho and Oporto are covered by these Troops; their advanced Guards reach to Villa Buoca. Almeida is not yet invested; that Place is sufficiently provided with all Necessaries. The extreme hot Season has rendered the Spaniards inactive, being melted in their Tents. The Troops of Portugal are in a cooler Situation, being in Quarters of Cantonment.

Yesterday another Chest of Gold Doubloons was found among the Hermione's Prize Money at the Bank.

WILLIAMSBURG, O. S.

WHEREAS I have received a Letter from his Excellency Sir *John Mordaunt*, dated New-York, September 20th, in Answer to that which I wrote lately, requesting a Convey for the Trade of this Country. I have thought proper, by the Advice of the Council, and for the Satisfaction of the Publick, to publish the following Extract from it.

FRANCIS FAUQUIER.

"The unexpected Arrival of the Enemy at Newfoundland, the Necessity of Dislodging them from thence before Winter sets in, and the Loss of Force Lord *Colwell* had with him to assist in effecting that Service, obliged me to send him all the Succours I possibly could: Without the Loss of his Lordship could not have proceeded from Halifax, and as it was very uncertain whether any Ships from England would arrive in Time, I thought it necessary to order the *Enterprise* to join his Lordship; but at the same Time directed Capt. *Hawton* to return immediately to Virginia, in order to convey the Homeward bound Trade, if he received certain Intelligence that Lord *Colwell* was joined by any Ships from Europe, to make his Force superior to that of the Enemy: I likewise wrote to his Lordship, desiring a Ship of War might be ordered for the above Service, as soon as one could be spared; and on the Receipt of your Letter Yesterday, I repeated my Request, and forwarded it by the *Prosperity* Sloop, the Captain of which has my Orders to make the utmost Dispatch in joining his Lordship, so that I make no Doubt but that the *Galley* or *Enterprise* are now on their Way back, or that Lord *Colwell* will send some other Vessel, so soon as the Service will permit him."

PHILADELPHIA, October 14.

In several late Letters, by Captain *Dee* from Liverpool, mention is made of a Peace being at no great Distance, between England, France and Spain.

By Captain *Mills*, from Providence, we learn, that the General *Shirley* Privateer, Captain *French*, of that Port, has taken, and carried in there, two large French Frigates, said to be pierced for 24 Guns each, but mounted only 12. They were bound to Old France, from the Cape, and said to be immensely rich: their Cargoes Sugar and Coffee, and a great Quantity of Indigo.

The Privateer flying Harlequin, Capt. *Wright*, of New-York, has sent in there a French Brig, from Cape Francois for Bourdeaux; her Cargo Sugar, Coffee, and some Indigo; she failed in Company with 19 Sail, under Convoy of six Ships of the Line, having on board the different Vessels the greatest Part of Anstruther's Regiment, lately taken and carried into the Cape, on their Voyage to the Havannah.

Extract of a Letter from New-York, O. S. 11.

"The Rhode-Island Packet-Boat is just arrived, and brings an Account, that they had Advice there, Via Boston, that upon Lord *Colvill's* appearing off of St. John's, the French Admiral sent out a Flag of Truce, desiring a free Passage for his Ships and Garrison, and that he would, on that Condition, deliver up the Town; but Lord *Colvill* refused his Demand, and sent him for Answer, he would have both Town and Shipping; and the Master of the Packet-Boat says, That Lord *Colvill* had got Possession of all. The Packet-Boat left Rhode-Island last Saturday."—We hope the above will be confirmed.

ANNAPOLIS, October 21.

Last Thursday Night and Friday Forenoon, we had a North-easterly Storm. About IV o'Clock on Friday Morning the Snow *Peace*, Capt. *Thomas Lovell*, bound for *Baltimore*, being then in the Bay, was forced ashore about Two League above the Mouth of *Patuxent*, and Bilged: Her Cargo consisted of 211 Hogheads of Tobacco, 22 Tons of Bar-Iron, and 5 or 6000 Staves, which it is feared is chiefly Lost.

Monday last, a Special Court was held here when *Thomas Hargrave* was convicted of Stealing a considerable Number of Guineas, Pistoles, Johannes, &c. and was burnt in the Hand with the initial Letter of the Word THIEF. Several Women, who were so far concerned with him as to prompt him on, and receive Part of the Money, were Ordered to give large Securities for their good Behaviour, or leave the Province in a few Days.

On the 8th Instant, *Michael Ford* was executed at *Federicktown*, for the Murder of Mr. *George Smith*, in the 1st Inst.

We mentioned in our Gazette of the 2nd of last Month, that the Child of Mr. *James*, of this County, was seized by a Mad Dog. The Child, a little Boy, about Three Years of Age, is now Dead: The Woman, who was well with Child, on the 21st Instant, she was seized with the same Malady, and died in a most shocking manner, till the 23rd Instant, when she Died.
