

ANNAPOLIS, Feb. 3.
SINCE Printing off the other Side of this GAZETTE, and just as this Side was ready for the Press, we received the Pennsylvania GAZETTE of Thursday last, which contains His Majesty's most Gracious SPEECH to both Houses of Parliament, on the 25th of November past, with the Addresses of the Lords and Commons; brought by the PIR PACKET, Captain Goddard, into New-York; with many Articles of News, some of which (as many as our Time will admit) we here insert.

GEORGE R.
WHEREAS Preliminaries, for restoring Peace, were signed at FONTAINEBLEAU, on the Third Day of this Instant November, by the Ministers of Us, the Most Christian King, and the Catholic King. And whereas, for the putting an End to the Calamities of War, as soon and as far as may be possible, it has been agreed between Us, His Most Christian Majesty, and His Catholic Majesty, as follows; that is to say,
That as soon as the Preliminaries shall be signed and ratified, all Hostilities should cease at Sea, and at Land.

And, to prevent all Occasions of Complaints and Disputes which might arise upon Account of Ships, Merchandizes, and other Effects, which might be taken at Sea, it has been also mutually agreed, That the Ships, Merchandizes, and Effects, which should be taken in the CHANNEL, and in the NORTH SEAS, after the Space of Twelve Days, to be computed from the Ratification of the present Preliminary Articles; and that all Ships, Merchandizes, and Effects, which should be taken after Six Weeks from the said Ratification, beyond the CHANNEL, the BRITISH SEAS, and the NORTH SEAS, as far as the CANARY ISLANDS inclusively, whether in the OCEAN or MEDITERRANEAN; and for the Space of Three Months, from the said CANARY ISLANDS to the EQUINOCTIAL LINE OF EQUATOR; and for the Space of Six Months, beyond the said EQUINOCTIAL LINE OF EQUATOR, and in all other Places of the World, without any Exception, or other more particular Distinction of Time or Place, should be restored on both Sides. AND WHEREAS the Ratifications of the said Preliminary Articles, in due Form, were exchanged at VERSAILLES, by the Plenipotentiaries of Us, of the Most Christian King, and of the Catholic King, on the Twenty-second of this Instant November, from which Day the several Terms abovementioned, of Twelve Days, of Six Weeks, of Three Months, and of Six Months, for the Restitution of all Ships, Merchandizes, and other Effects, taken at Sea, are to be computed.

WE have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council to notify the same to all Our loving Subjects; and We do declare, That Our Royal Will and Pleasure is, and We do hereby strictly Charge and Command all Our Officers, both at Sea and Land, and all other Our Subjects whatsoever, to forbear all Acts of Hostility, either by Sea or Land, against His Most Christian Majesty, and His Catholic Majesty, Their Vassals or Subjects, from and after the respective Times abovementioned, and under the Penalty of incurring Our highest Displeasure.

GIVEN at Our Court at St. JAMES'S, the Twenty-sixth Day of November, in the Third Year of Our Reign, and in the Year of Our LORD 1762.

Paris, Nov. 12. We learn from Cherbourg, that in the Night, between the 27th and 28th of October, another Hurricane drove ashore Nine of the King's Ships, which had put into the Road of that Port, in their Way from Caen to Brest. Four of those Ships are intirely beat to Pieces; the Five others remained whole when the Account came away, but it was feared it would be impossible to relieve them. There were not, however, above Three or Four Seamen or Soldiers Drowned.

LONDON, November 13.
The new Preliminaries which the King of Prussia hath proposed to the Court of Vienna, consist in an Offer to give up the Countries of Halberstadt and Mansfeld to the King of Poland, by Way of Indemnification, with some pecuniary Compensations; but, on the other Hand, he demands, that Silesia shall be solemnly guaranteed to him in Perpetuity, with a Strip of Bohemia, lying between the Elbe and Silesia. But the Empress Queen seems determined to hazard another Campaign, rather than submit to these Conditions.

They write from Hamburg, that some of the King of Prussia's Generals having spoke to him of a Peace with the Empress Queen, his Majesty made Answer, That that Prince's having rejected the Conditions he had offered her, he was determined to listen to no Accommodations till he should have put Things on the same Footing as at the Beginning of the War; that he perceived his great Fatigue hurt his Health, and would even shorten his Days, but that he was resolved to Die in the Field.

HOSTILITIES Cease

In the Channel and North Seas, 4th December. As far as the Canary Islands, 3d Jan. 1763. Beyond the Canary Islands, to the Line, 22d February.

Beyond the Line, 22d May.
In a short Time will sail from Plymouth two or three Men of War, and Transports, with 16 Lieutenants, and 3000 Seamen, to fetch home the Spanish Men of War from the Havannah.

It is said Orders are given for all his Majesty's Frigates in the Downs, Portsmouth, Plymouth, &c. to sail immediately on a Cruise, and to watch the Motions of the French Privateers, whom it is imagined will make a bold Push before they are called in, to seize upon some of our Merchant Ships.

Abstract from several other Paragraphs:
"His most Christian Majesty, when he signed the Articles, said, *He never wrote his Name with more Pleasure.*—That it was hoped, that while the definitive Treaty is settling, an Expedient would be found to reconcile the Courts of Vienna and Berlin, which would render the Pacification general.—That a complete Victory was obtained the 20th of October, near Freyberg, by Prince Henry of Prussia over the united Armies of Austrians and Imperialists, the Field of Battle, and Freyberg, quitted to the Prussians, who took 5 or 6000 Prisoners, and 30 Pieces of Cannon; the Prussians lost about 1400: Another Account says, he took one Major, 24 Captains, 41 Lieutenants, 11 Ensigns, and 4174 Private Men, 27 Pieces of Cannon, and nine Standards and Colours.—That an English Officer in Germany, wrote on the Second of November, That they had had five Rejoicings in the Space of Ten Days, For the Reduction of the Havannah, Retaking Newfoundland, Taking of Schweidnitz, The Victory gained by Prince Henry of Prussia, and The Surrender of Cassel: So many, in so short a Space of Time not having happened this War."
