Feb. 16. On Monday last answed here from Belfast about. Twelve Families of Irish Protestants, configure of about Seventy Persons, in Consequence of the Encouragement given to Settlers by this Province. The new Township formerly mentioned, defigned for the Irish Settlers is near Long-Canes, in one of the happiest of Climates, and faid to be equal in Fertility and Goodness to any Lands on the Face of the Globe.

Feb. 19. The Brig Success, Captain Morrison, which arrived here last Monday, was taken the 21st of January, in Latitude 33, 44. Longitude 58. by a French Privateer, called the Diane, commanded by M. Simonin, belonging to Bayonne (which Port the failed from the 4th of November, and was then returning to, from Cape Francois) and ranfomed for 500 l. Sterling. The fame Privateer had before taken a Guernfey Ship, a West-India Packet Boat (with all the Mails on board, except that for Barbados, which had been landed) a Schooner from Antigua for Essequebo, a Brigantine from Briftol for Martinico, James Thompson, Master, and the Snow Cape Breton, Capt. Wilson, from New-York for the West-Indies, all which was sent away for Port Louis in Hispaniola. Capt. Wilson was put on board and is arrived here in the Success, from whom we have this Information.

Monday last arrived here 69 Irish Protestants from Belfast, to settle in this Province, upon the Encouragement given by the Legislature, in an Act paffed the 25th of July 1761. The Lands allotted for them to fettle on, we are informed is fome of the best in the Province, and equal to any on this Continent. And we are told, that upon the Accounts these People may transmit to Ireland, some hundred Families of these useful Settlers may

be expected to follow them. PORTSMOUTH (New Hampsbire) January 28. We hear from Somersworth in this Province, that on the 13th Infant, the House of one Benja-min Quimby of that Place, together with the Furniture and every Article therein, was confumed by Fire: The particular Circumstances attending it would be too tedious to relate; this one perhaps may convey to a thinking Mind, how terrible it must be to the Family, that the Wife was oblig'd by the Fire's being so fierce upon them, to throw their little Children and Others of the Family, out of the Chamber Windows, with nothing but their Shirts and Shifts to cover their Nakedness: One of the Family, about 14 Years of Age, though confined to his Bed with a Fever, was thrown out in the same Condition, and then the Wife jumpt out likewise, naked as the rest, all of which happen'd on a severe cold stormy Morning. Mr. Quimby's Occupation being a Clothier, he had then in his House near Two Thousand Yards of Cloth, mostly dressed and fit to return to the Owners, all of which was consumed, as well as his Tools, &c. for the Clothier's Business, together with five Hogs that were in a Stye adjoining the
