ONE of our Benighted, remarked, that the Frost has penetrated the Ground deeper this Winter than in 1750. He found his Garden that Winter was better than 8 Lines deep, which is not to be attributed in a great Measure to the Want of Snow.

Cox, Dec. 24. It is said by some People that our Court has resolved to purchase our Ships of War that were taken at the *Halifax*; and that the Minister we shall send to *London* will be charged with this Commission, which those Ships come to *Europe*.

Paris, Jan. 21. Melancholy Accidents happen every Day in this City from the Frost. The Snow is so soon cleared of Ice, that it is again froze over. A young Gentleman of Fortune in crossing the River on the Ice, by Way of *Bravado*, fell in, and was drowned; upon which his Footman, who was ordered to follow him, prudently turned back. The Arrival of all the Mails is retarded by the Ice and the Frost. Nobody gains by the hard Weather but the Wood Merchants who supply us with Fire.

We learn from *Avignon*, that the Rhone is frozen over in several Parts; and that if the Frost continues, both in that Country and in *Provence* the Olive and other Trees will suffer severely.

LONDON, Dec. 7. A few Days since died at *Holt* in *Norfolk*, aged 75, one *Robert Smith*, who for near 34 Years rode Post from that Place to *Thetford*, which is 46 measured Miles) six Days in every Week, and never missed but one Day in that long Period, till he left off about Twelve Days before his Death: it is remarkable he always rid one Pace, and set out at such an Hour, and returned at the same fixed Time, which Practice he never once deviated from. In the *Wests* above 80,000 Miles, which would extend about 20 Times round the Globe.

A short Time ago, one *John Pilkington*, a Scotch Sailor, got upon the Tower of *St. Botolph* Church in *Lincolnshire*, which is reckoned the highest and finest Tower Steeple in *England*: on the Top of it there are eight Vases of Weather-Cocks, all which he went round; and coming to the last, to show his Courage, went round that twice, but the Vane giving Way, he fell down and broke his Neck.

Dec. 17. It is said that about a 100 Ships of War will be kept in Commission at their lower Complement of Men, and that they will be in various Stations; to see the Treaty lately concluded in *Madrid* and literally adhered to.

Yesterday a Wager of a Thousand Pounds against Fifty, laid some Time ago by two Gentlemen of Note in the City, was determined and paid. The Part in Question was, whether the Preliminaries were signed the 30th of *Novemb.* He who betted 1000 l. owned for the *Yes* and was proved five to ten against the other. The Matter being proved against him, he has generously paid. It is probable his Proposition in this Wager, arose from his Correspondent's wrong Information by a white Horse: The Preliminaries, as well as we can recollect, did agree about all the Preliminaries the 23d of *Novemb.* and not over a 100 l. but did not sign them till the next Morning.

Yes. On Friday some Gentlemen sitting at a House near *Baylor* Street, made the following Experiment, to show the Impenetrability of Fire: They put a Glass of Water on a Table in the Bowling Green, and in six Minutes it was froze over so hard as to bear five Shillings put on it, one after the other. They then took a Glass of *Port*, and a Glass of *Brandey*, when the Wine was froze over the *Brandey*, and the *Brandey* was broke with the *Brandey*. It has not been before.

They write from *Florence*, that at *Verona* the Shirt of *Charles* is kept hanging in one of the New Churches, under a Case of *Iron*, and the *Brandey* is so preserved, that it has not melted out in a great Fire, it was not that kills the Traveller, but my Father, who threw him in.
