IHAVE the Honour to acquaint you, that my Orders, and that His Majesty, of whom I have a Copy, is a sufficient Tender of my Order should be fired upon.

Without further Recollection my Letter to your Grace Lord Howe, with Regard to the therefore claim these Officers, from your Grace immediately delivered up were not mentioned; for the second I looked on as in further beg your Grace to be acquainted with Lord Howe: Is this in it? No. Every Article changed Seamen, released the Terms of the Cartel, as Parcel.
