The People saved nothing but what they had on their Backs, and had nothing to eat all the while they were in that distressed Condition. The Horses were all drown'd in the Hold. From this the Report of a Vessel being lost, and only 15 Persons saved, took its Rise.

Last Week a Sailor who had been paid off on board one of the Men of War in Portsmouth Harbour, being in Liquor, swore he would throw his Wages overboard, which amounted to 24 Guineas, and actually did so, in spite of all that his Brother Tars could do to prevent it.

Amidst the Abundance of Tales received from Portsmouth, and other maritime Towns, with regard to the lavish Pranks of Sailors, it is with Pleasure that we communicate an Instance of contrary Behaviour that happened lately at Southampton, in the Conduct of an honest, brave, and fortunate Fellow, who hath been many Years past stationed in the East-Indies, and who by Prize Money, good Economy and Industry, hath found Means to return possessed of upwards of One Thousand Pounds. On Enquiry after his Family, he found that his Father had been dead some Time, and much in Debt; he immediately made himself acquainted with the Creditors of the deceased, invited them to a Public House, entertained them with a handsome and plentiful Supper, and demanded each Person's Account, discharged all the Debts, and the Bill of the House, &c. the Whole amounting to more than One Hundred Pounds.

Inverness, March 3. This Day the Earl of Sutherland's Battalion of Highlanders was muster'd, review'd, and lodged their Arms in Presence of Lieut. Col. Wedderburn of the 68th Regiment. The Regiment was very complete, and made a very fine Appearance; after having lodged their Arms, the Men were thanked by the commanding Officer of the Regiment, for their good Behaviour since they were raised, and received his Majesty's royal Bounty of Ten Shillings each; after which they dispersed according to the Orders, without the least Noise or Disturbance. Since this Regiment has been raised, there has not one Man deserted, and there has never been a Complaint from any Quarters they were in.

N E W Y O R K, May 19.
On Tuesday last arrived here a Sloop from Martinico, which brought Letters for several Gentlemen in Town. We hear that a Vessel had just arrived there, that was met at Sea by another Vessel from the East-Indies, bound to England, having Col. Coote on board, who stop'd the Vessel till he wrote and sent on board her a Letter for General Rufane, Governor of Martinico, giving an Account of the Conquest of the Island of Manilla, by Col. Draper, in November last, where he found Two Millions, some say Two and a Half Millions Sterling in Specie, and that a rich Acapulco Ship had also fallen into his Hands.

The same Day Captain _____ arrived here from the Havannah, which Place he left the Second Inst. He acquaints us, That the Day before he sailed from thence, an English Officer, that had formerly been a Sergeant, but had obtained a Commission for his Bravery at the Attack of the Moro, was executed there for the Murder of an English Soldier, which was occasioned by Means of a WOMAN; and that a Spaniard, who had been one of the Murderers of Messrs. Boyd and Reed, turned King's Evidence, and discovered the whole Scene; but notwithstanding, he was to be executed the 3d Inst. The Spaniard said there were six concerned, who all fled to the Mountains; and that by the noble Resistance made by Mr. Boyd, who got a Hangar in the Fray, they were almost cut to Pieces before they could finish him. Mr. Reed they finished at one Blow, as he was leaning down to draw some Wine out of a Cask for them.

ANNAPOLIS, June 2.
On Thursday last Died at his House at West-River, KENSEY JOHNS, Esq; High Sheriff of this County. He was a tender Husband, affectionate Father, sincere Friend, upright Magistrate, humane Officer, kind Neighbour, and cheerful Companion: His Death is sincerely lamented by all his Friends, and the Loss to his Family is truly deplorable, being snatched from them in the very Prime of Life, aged no more than 42 Years.
