St. JOHN'S (in ANTIGUA) April 27. Extract of a Letter from Bartholomew Putman, Master of the Schooner Leopard, who sailed from this Island the 21st Instant, bound for Martinico, dated Basseterre, Guadalupe, April the 25th, to a Person in this Town.

It is with much Grief I acquaint you of my great Misfortune, which I met with the 23d at one o'Clock in the Morning, for Leagues Distance from Dominica, W. S. W. being boarded by a Spanish PRIVATE, and after being stripe and used barbarously, was turned adrift with my Boat without Water, or Provisions of any Kind.

I cannot inform you rightly where she belonged to; only from what they told me, which was, that she did belong to the Island of Margaritta, and that the Captain's Name is Antony.—She had on Carriage and 12 Swivel Guns, and 24 Hands; but had muzzed six Pieces, and for the most Part cruised off Dominica, and has been there for 3 Weeks. I beg you would send this Account to my Owners in Salem.

The above Schooner of Capt. Putman's is about 80 Tons Burthen, Newberry built, long and narrow; this her second Voyage from New England; has a long Quarter Deck, which takes in her Main-mast and Pumps; has a Scuttle under the Tiller before the Rudder-cast of about 18 or 20 Inches Square; her Cabin Floor neatly ciled; has plain solid Quarter Pieces; and two Top-masts to carry standing Top-sails; tarred Sides, and black Bottom.

BOSTON, May 30.

By a Gentleman lately arrived from Jamaica, we learn, that on or about the first of April, a Number of Negroes in the Country having attempted an Insurrection on the Inhabitants, a Party went out against them, and speedily put a Stop to their Progress, after their barbarously murdering several of the Settlers there. Several of the Negroes were taken and executed before the Gentleman left that Place.

NEW-YORK, June 2.

On Tuesday last arrived the Brigantine Gosport, Capt. Alexander Taylor, in 8 Weeks from Gibraltar, from whence Admiral Saunders's Squadron sail'd for England three Days before he left that Place, where Sir Piercy Brett, and Commodore Amherst, were left with 3 Ships of the Line, and 3 Frigates.
