Amongst those gone out on the Occasion, are the following Voluntier Companie viz. Captain Laughlin, of Big Spring, and Men, all raised in Twenty-four Hours. Capta Patterson, jun. and Captain Bedford, with Thir Men each (these two Companies chiefly from bout and below Carlisse) Captain Crawford, fro the upper Part of the County, with Nineteen Mer Captain Sharp, from above Shippensburg with Fourteen Men; besides several others th joined under commissioned Captains, as being b ter acquainted with them. And it may, with gre Justice, be faid, that the Flower of Cumberla County are gone out on this Expedition. In next I hope to give you some Account of the vent of this Undertaking; and, whatever it m be, yet it must be confessed the Design is god and may be attended with Consequences of gr Advantage.
