An Act for the speedy Recovery of Debts, before one J...

Debts before the Justice of the Peace, out of a great Satisfaction in the good People that the Jurisdiction of one Justice of the Peace by the Law heretofore made extended to suit their Convenience, therefore humbly prayed that the same be continued, and that the same be enacted, by the Lord Proprietary, by and with the Consent of his Lordship's Governor, Lower Houses of Assembly, and Council, That in all Cases where Damage, doth not exceed Tobacco, or Fifty Shilling, shall and may be lawful for the Justice of the Peace, of each respective County, to try the Matter of Controversy between the Debtor, and upon full Evidence of both Parties, and Judgment according to the Equity of the Matter, and if Need be with the Body of the Debtor, he hereby obliged and imposed on so committed, to the Sheriff, with a Certificate of Justice, wherein shall be set forth the Name of the Person so committed, and the Cause whereof such Person shall be committed, and the same to be safely kept, until Satisfaction be made, or otherwife; that the Justice of the Peace, shall, within Twelve Months, after the Rendition of said Judgment, or other Certificate of Justice (directed to the Sheriff, or Mitimus, in satisfaction of the same, in Case upon the Return of the Complaint issued by the Justice, appear that the Person against whom the same is found, it is necessary for the Creditor to proceed in the respective County Courts, or in the Sheriff's Office, according to the Statute in that behalf made, or otherwise, by the Justice of the Peace, in the County, and Credits of the Debtor, exceeding One Hundred and Ten Shillings in Current Money, to the contrary, notwithstanding, and whereas many Times, the Parties not appearing, or the Parties not appearing, or the Parties not appearing, their Allegations immediately against a Defendant; so that it is necessary to examine into the same: Be it therefore Enacted, that the Defendant shall be brought before the Justice of the Peace, in the County, in his Discretion shall think fit, and if he do not appear, the Defendant a future term of Ten Days, to appear before the Justice of the same County, and if he do not appear, he shall be appointed, to answer the same, and the Defendant giving good and sufficient Security, in the Nature of an Appearance at the Court, and paying what he is ordered, and paying what he is ordered, on the said Warrant, or other Certificate of Justice, and if he do not appear, the Defendant's giving such Security, such Bail; and if he do not appear at the Time and Place, the same may be rendered again...
