D R E S D E N,

WE learn from the attachment of Russia entered that all the Russian taken refuge in

Warsaw, Sept. 3. On the 2^d reference with the Primate and the Crown, the Russian Ambassador that he was empowered by the reign to order the Russian Troops to Mecklenburgh; which Orders he, for them accordingly.

Hague, Sept. 30. It is reported that Prussia proposes to march 20,000 Mecklenburgh; but no Reason is given. It is certain that his Majesty is discharging a great many Men from Mecklenburgh, and the Neighbourhood of Holstein: But they are not to be sent to any other Territory.

Sept. 27. It is reported that the King has sent a Minister extraordinary to the Government that they cannot see with Pleasure, that they should sell, or suffer to be carried away, the Powder that is made in the Sort of Ammunition, whether it be for the Russians, or for the Prussians, and that he requires that they should pay Attention to it. The King's Request was, that the King of Prussia, and acknowledged the King's Sovereign than the King of Prussia, should not see by what Right he might interfere in their Commerce; to which the King of Prussia, that his Commission being to set out directly for Berlin, he has an Account of it to the King, that the King's Monarch would write on the subject. And we are assured, that we write a Letter to them, with which we know not the Contents.

LONDON, Saturday Evening last, the Right Honourable Granby, John Wilkes, Esq. C. Churchill, seated themselves at Drury Lane Theatre, and on that occasion such loud Shouts of Applause, as for some Time interrupted the Performance.

As the Demolition of the Fort of Mifflin seem not to take place, we are informed, that the French, according to their usual custom, have found out, that the Demolition shall be made, if Great Britain will have it, and the Council filled up with Expenses.

It is said, that an emigrant from South-Carolina, is now engaged in Ship-Wrights, Carpenters, &c. at Providence, in order to carry on the Building in all its Branches. The Nature of the Materials, it is thought, is better than that of New-England, and being found to be of a more durable Nature in any to the Northward.

There is now finished the most valuable Piece of Plate, and of the most workmanship ever yet made in any Part of the World, viz. a silver, double gilt; which is to be sent to the Empress of Russia, by the Merchants.

We hear Orders are gone out from the Province of New-York, that the Pewees to be melted down, and the Pieces of Four-Pounders, and all Hand-Granades are prepared for North-America.

By a private Letter from Padua, we are informed, that the Countess of Nadau (Son to the Governor of Padua) was tried and degraded by the King, for having embarked for the West-India, where she was to be married to a free Sitters, who were to be sent to the West-India, if they were on board of war.
