THE Body of the late King, our Sovereign, was exposed on the 15th, on a Berl of State, in the Audience Chamber, with all the Marka of Royalty. At the Foor was placed the Heart of his Majeffy, in a Box covered with Gold and Silver Tiffoe, with Four Stools with rich Cushions, on which were placed the Electoral Sword, the Scepter, the Globe, and the Collar of the Order of the White Eagle, goarded by two Turkish Halberdiers. On each Side were placed Righteen Silver Stands, with lighted Wax Tapers, and at ome Diffance were fistioned two Adjutants General, two Chamberlains, two Gentlemen of the Chamber, and fix Carabineers.
