## DRESDEN, October 16.

THE Body of the late King, our Sovereign, was exposed on the 15th, on a Bed of State, in the Audience Chamber, with all the Marks of Royalty. At the Foot was placed the Heart of his Majesty, in a Box covered with Gold and Silver Tissue, with Four Seals with rich Cushions, on which were placed the Electoral Sword, the Scepter, the Globe, and the Collar of the Order of the White Eagle, guarded by two Turkish Halberdiers. On each Side were placed Eighteen Silver Stands, with lighted Wax Tapers; and at some Distance were stationed two Adjutants General, two Chamberlains, two Gentlemen of the Chamber, and six Carabineers. The Chamber was superbly illuminated, and every one is permitted to enter it, from Six in the Morning to Ten in the Evening.

## LONDON, November 4.

A Gentleman of great Wealth and Influence, is now soliciting for a Grant of a large Tract of Land on the Coast of Georgia, which he intends to settle on the same Principles with those of the famous Mr. PENN, Proprietor of Pennsylvania; which, if it takes place, may be a happy Means of establishing the other Parts of the British Colonies on that Continent.

The Post of Attorney-General, now vacant, is said to be worth upwards of 7000 l. per Annum; and that the Right Hon. Fletcher Norton, Esq; the Solicitor-General, Mr. De Grey, and Mr. Sewel, are Three of the Gentlemen talked of as likely to succeed Mr. York in that important Office.

## Extract of a Letter from Cork, October 27.

The Good Intent, of Scarborough (Transport) with the 48th (Webb's) and 56th (Keppel's) Regiment of Foot, from the Havannah, left from Plymouth, are arrived, and Yesterday marched into Town. The former Regiment embarked at this Place for America about Nine Years since, upon the beginning of the Troubles in that Part of the World, when it was commanded by Col. Dunbar, and consisted of 1000 effective Men, since when it has suffered so much, that Nine private Men only are returned. The 56th consists of about 200 private, most of which are Draughts from other Regiments since their Return to England. These Regiments were the last of our Troops left at the Havannah, which they evacuated on the Arrival of the Spanish Garrison. Two other Transports with Troops from America arrived this Day at Cove, and the Men are just marched into Town.

Yesterday a New-York Mail arrived at the General Post-Office, by the Duke of Cumberland Packet-boat, Captain Goodridge, having made her Passage out and home in Ten Weeks, and was Nineteen Days only from New-York.

The Hollanders are very angry, and say, that they have been cajoled, and made the Dupes of England for some Years past; and that now they have given them a King, in a Stadholder.

We are informed that there will be no Trial for the North Briton, No. 45. It is said an eminent Person in the Law has declared it as his Opinion, that it would be unconstitutional to try the said Affair; and that he could not answer it to his Conscience to plead in that Cause.

Yesterday the Committee of Merchants, appointed to redress their Grievances at the Havannah, waited on the Commander in Chief, and were very generally received; and were promised, as soon as the Attorney General's Opinion on his State of the Affair was known, he would give them all the Satisfaction in his Power; on which they took Leave, with this Assurance however, that they were determined to have Redress at all Events.
