

CHESTER-TOWN RACES.

ON the second Thursday in May next, will be Run for, on the Race-Ground adjoining to said Town, a Purse of THIRTY PISTOLES, free for any Horse, Mare, or Gelding, not more than half Blood, on the following Terms:

Every Horse, Mare, or Gelding, that runs for the said Purse, shall, if rising 4 Years old next Grass, carry 8 Stone (Saddle and Bridle included), if Five, 8 Stone and 10 Pounds; if Six, 9 Stone and 6 Pounds; and Aged 10 Stone.

Proper Judges will be appointed to determine all Disputes which may arise.
