

with 22 Soldiers, and some Countrymen, who were to take six Days Provision with them: That on the 24th, about 3 o'Clock in the Afternoon, a Woman was shot through the Neck by a Party of four Indians, who were pursued, and fired on by some of our People; and that about two Hours after, three of the Enemy crossed the Highway, and were also followed and fired at by our Men, but we have no Account of any of them being taken or wounded. It is likewise said that the Indians, in their Retreat, met with and wounded several of the Inhabitants badly."

WILLIAMSBURG, May 25.
This Day were executed at the Gallows near this City, pursuant to their Sentence, Bartholomew Roberts, William Abney, and Robert Barnard, for Forgery; and Littleberry Thompson, for Murder. They all behaved very composedly, and with seeming Resignation to their unhappy Fate. The counterfeiting and passing our Paper Currency being attended with the most destructive Consequences to the Credit of the Colony, and large Quantities of it being at this Time in Circulation, it is to be hoped that all concerned in this base and baneful Traffick will take Warning from the untimely End of those who have now suffered.
