IT is astonishing, that (notwithstanding the Poor, and repeated Complaints of Provisions) those who have it in their Power to exert that Power to put a Stop to the dearth of Wheat, before it be too late. For past, the Exportation at the Ports, altho' has increased daily. At *Lynn*, very common to see thirty, forty, or fifty Wheat delivered in a Morning; and this is of the Grain that is brought there by Water, with as much Expedition as the Shipping will admit of; and this being the case, they cannot be at a Stand for the late many other Ports in the Kingdom export in Proportion, and with as much Expedition will, in a few Weeks, be impossible to rectify till the next Crop, and perhaps not then, have a very favourable Harvest; so that (old Proverb) when the Seed is sown, they reap.

The Integrity, Brown, from *Castro Bay* to *London*, at Sea the 17th of March, in *Lat. 54: 43*. The Crew were taken up by the *Virginia* to *Glasgow*.

Yesterday there was but a thin Market at *Cattle* sold somewhat dearer than on Monday purchased a small House-Lamb, which weighed but remarkably fat, for which he gave 55 s.

It is reported, that the Dutch Agents have Orders for Guns, Pistols, Swords, &c. for the Forces going to the East-Indies; all to be furnished with utmost Expedition.

A considerable Quantity of Plate, Furniture, Property of a late Suckler for Liberty, has for preceding Days, been selling at the Royal Exchange.

Large Orders are gone to Cork and Dublin, for Pork, and Butter, which it is hoped will in reduce the exorbitant Price of Provisions in *March*.

March 24. It is with the greatest Satisfaction to the Public, that, from the great Attention of the Sovereign has for the Good of his Subjects, of Man is soon like to be purchased of its Property annexed to the Crown of Great-Britain.

We mind our Readers how often, and in what a very important a Measure, both in the Hon. House, and out of it, has been to no Manner commended for above thirty Years past, altho' felt arising from this notorious Seat of Smuggling, glaringly disgraced and impoverished the Nation.
