We hear, that lately a great Number of People have Died in Talbot County, especially Negroes, of a malignant Distemper, supposed to have been brought in by a Vessel with Servants from Ireland; but that it is now in some measure abated.

On Tuesday last Week, one Robert King, a Man who had a Wife and Six Children, having been Drinking too much at George-Town in Frederick County, complain'd that he was too Hot, and very foolishly stripp'd and plunged into the Water to cool himself; but was immediately Drowned. His Body was taken up about 10 or 12 Minutes after.
