Instant, there is Advice, that a Party of ours had been out after the Enemy, whom they came in Sight of, and fired at, but could not come up with; and that as the Indians were flying from our People, a white Boy, they had Prisoner, fell from his Horse, upon which they killed and scalped him, cut off his Head, and left it in the Road.

On Tuesday Night last the Captain of a New-England Schooner, lying at Chestnut-street Wharsf, had his Chest opened, and a Bag carried off, containing Four Hundred and Fisty Dollars. And we hear there were sundry Things besides taken from the Vessel.
