By a Letter from Fort Bedford, dated the 15th Instant, there is Advice, that a Party of ours had been out after the Enemy, whom they came in Sight of, and fired at, but could not come up with; and that as the Indians were flying from our People, a white Boy, they had Prisoner, fell from his Horse, upon which they killed and scalped him, cut off his Head, and left it in the Road.

On Tuesday Night last the Captain of a New-England Schooner, lying at Chestnut-street Wharf, had his Chest opened, and a Bag carried off, containing Four Hundred and Fifty Dollars. And we hear there were sundry Things besides taken from the Vessel.

ANNAPOLIS, July 5. Last Tuesday, an extreme Hot Day, one George Husford, a Servant Man, being very Warm at cutting of Wood a little Way from Town, went to a Spring, and drank heartily of the Water, and a few Minutes after dropp'd down Dead.

On Monday last two Men, who arrived from Ireland the Day before, playing in a Canoe, near Town, the overfet, by which Accident one of them, a Sailor, whose Name was Lawrence Prim, was Drowned, and the other narrowly escap'd.

At Queen-Anne's County Court, last Week, a Negro Fellow of Mr. Helmsley's, was sentenced to Death, for Stabbing a few Days before one John Sewil, an Overseer; who died instantly on receiving his Wound.
