NEW-YORK, July 30.

On Tuesday last, in the Ship John, from Newry, Luke Kiersted, Master, there arrived about 300 Passengers; the Rev. As their principal View is to carry on the Linen and Hempen Manufactures, to which they are all well bred, doubtless they will meet with the good Graces of every true Friend to this Province, especially at this Juncture, when their Encouragement is so absolutely necessary; and it is said there are many others who will soon follow their laudable Example.

ANNAPOLIS, August 9.

By Capt. Thompson we are informed, That on Wednesday the 25th of last Month, Two Women were killed near Fort Loudon, in Cumberland County. On Thursday the 26th, at a School-House, near Capt. Potter's in Conococheague, Robert Brown, and Nine Children, were scalped, and Four Children were carried off Prisoners. Two of the Nine Children that were scalped, are yet living, and say, that Four Indians did the Damage at the School-House. The School-Master was shot, and the Children killed with Tomahawks.
