Extract of a Letter from *Dublin* to a Friend in *London*, May 19, 1764.

"Lord and Lady *Northumberland* have left this Kingdom, to the universal Regret of Ranks and Degrees of People. I never saw anything like it: I happened to mix among the Palace at the *Water-side*, and the Prayers, and serenade Wishes poured forth for a safe Voyage and long Continuance in the Government, had such an Effect on me. — It was much for a Mind of the least Sensibility. I saw the Crowd, retired Home, and watched them 'til it was dark.

"In the Memory of us now alive, our Fathers, there have been but four Viceroy's of *Ireland*, distinguished with Honour among the People, by Liberality; the Duke of *Dorset* the Confidence of Men by a steady Adherence to his Word; and the Lord *Chesterfield* merited the Esteem of this whole Kingdom, by his equitable and impartial Conduct towards all Parties, whether Court or Country, Protestant or Papist.
