barricadoed the Reft. That they afterwards put into St. Thomas's, where Taggot was encouraged by a Spaniard to go down to Porto-Rico to fell the Negroes, and he fet fail directly; but on his Arrival the Spaniards put the Trick on him, by first going on board with a Number, under Pretence of Trade, feizing the Vessel, and carrying the Crew into his Boat, with Intent to imprison them on Shore: That on their way thither the Englishmen ran off with the Boat down to Mona, where they landed the Spaniard who gave the Encouragement; from thence they went to St. Domingo, and fome of them afterwards proceeded to Jamaica to give Information; but the Brig and Cargo, we are told, are confiscated by the Tenor of Treaties.
A Sloop, Campbell Master, of Jamaica, bound

to the Grenades with King's Stores, having sprung a Leak on her Passinge, and not being able to beat up, fell to Leeward, and defigned for jamaica, but was drove on Shore, on the South Side of

Hispaniola, where the Vessel and Cargo were lost, and ten Persons drowned.

ANNAPOLIS, August 23.

Tuesday last about Noon, a Quarrel happen'd in our Jail, between two Prisoners about their Dinner, which came to Blows; and after exchanging a few Knocks, one of them, Robert Yieldall, fell down and inftantly Expired. He has left a poor Widow and Eight Children.

Monday last arrived here from Briftol, the Albon, Capt. Thomas Spencer, after a long Passage, with about 100 Passengers, sent in by his Majesty to tarry in his American Colonies for the Term of Seven Years. It feems they were very loth to leave their Native Country, and endeavour'd, foon after failing, to conquer the Ship's Company, and take the Veilel under their own Command but after the Company's Firing among them, and Crippling some, they were subdued.
