PHILADELPHIA RACES.

ON Tuesday the 25th of September next will be run for, on the Race Ground of this City, near the Center House, A Purse of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, free for any Horse, Mare or gelding, carrying 10 Stone, Bridle and Saddle, included; to run Three Four Mile Heats; to start between the Hours of Three and Four in the Afternoon, and to be subject to Articles formed on the Plan of his Majesty's, which will be ready to be signed by the Owners. Every Horse, Mare or Gelding, that runs for the said Purse, to be shown and entered at Mr. Peter Spence's, at the Center House, on Friday the 21st, paying Six Pounds Entrance Money for Full blooded Horses, Five Pounds for Three Quarter, and Four Pounds Ten Shillings for Half Bloods, the several Degrees of which to be properly certified, to the Satisfaction of the Judges; but in case any shall incline to enter Six Hours before starting, such Owner to pay Seven Pounds Ten Shillings, without Exception; nor will less than Four reputed running Horses be allowed to run for the said Purse. On Wednesday many Matches will be run, and consequently a Day of Entertainment. On Thursday the 27th a Purse of ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS will be run for, by Four Year-old Horses, carrying Nine Stone, Bridle and Saddle included; to run Three Three Mile Heats; to start between the Hours of Three and Four in the Afternoon, and to be subject to the same Articles as before mentioned. Every Horse, Mare or Gelding, that runs for this Purse, to be shown and entered on Saturday the 22d, at Mr. Peter Spence's aforesaid, paying Two Pistoles Entrance Money; but in case any should incline to enter his Horse Six Hours before starting, and brings with him a proper Certificate of his Age, such Owner to pay Three Pistoles; nor will less than four Horses be allowed to run for this Purse. On Friday the Entrance Money of the former Day will be run for, in such Races as the Judges may think will contribute to the Entertainment of the Company. And Saturday will be a Day of Sport.
