### PHILADELPHIA RACES.

**O**N Tuesday the 25th of September Inst. will be run for, on the Race Ground of this City, near the Center House, A Purse of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, free for any Horse, Mare or gelding, carrying 10 Stone, Bridle and Saddle, included; to run Three Four Mile Heats; to start between the Hours of Three and Four in the Afternoon, and to be subject to Articles formed on the Plan of his Majesty's, which will be ready to be signed by the Owners. Every Horse, Mare or Gelding, that runs for the said Purse, to be shewn and entered at Mr. Peter Spence's, at the Center House, on Friday the 21st, paying Six Pounds Entrance Money for Full blooded Horses, Five Pounds for Three Quarter, and Four Pounds Ten Shillings for Half Bloods, the several Degrees of which to be properly certified, to the Satisfaction of the Judges; but in case any shall incline to enter Six Hours before starting, such Owner to pay Seven Pounds Ten Shillings, without Exception; nor will less than Four reputed running Horses be allowed to run for the said Purse.
