"By a Letter from Conococheague, dated the 19th Instant, we learn, that a considerable Number of Indians were seen on the 17th, near Fort Littleton; that they fired on a Man hunting his Horses, but he got off from them; and that a Number of Men went immediately to the Place, and found the Tracks, and Signs of the Savages being there, but could not find any of them. We also hear from the upper End of this County, that the Enemy have been seen very lately on the Frontiers of Virginia, and last Week murdered a Family on the South Branch."
