LONDON, Declaration of his Most Christian Majesty, with Regard to the Canadians.

THE King of Great-Britain, fir'd that the Payment of Exchange, and been delivered to the Necessaries furnished by the said Troops, should be secured; his Majesty, entirely disposed to render that Justice which is legally declared, and does declare, that Letters of Exchange, shall be agreeable to a Liquidation made Time, according to the Distance and to what shall be possible; that ever that the Bills, and Letters of the French Subjects may have a Declaration, be not confounded and Letters of Exchange, which are of the new Subjects of the Britain.

In Witness whereof, We, the Ministers of his Most Christian Majesty, for this Purpose, have signed this Declaration, and caused the Seal of our Kingdom to be put thereto.

Done at Paris the 10th of February (L. S.) CHOISEUL. Duc de Choiseul.

Extract of a Letter from a Merchant dated June 9, 1764, to his Correspondent. "We have little talked of the loss sustained by the Burning of our Warehouse, which is computed at 800,000 l. supposed by most People to be of the under Officers, who often neglect of stealing Things, but perhaps valuable, and had an Opportunity to withstand, and to cover their Vices Whole on Fire.

"It is remarkable that no Smother Fire, were admitted near this in the Sealing Office, where no Fire the three preceding Days; and this trophe took its Rise a great Distance off, where many valuable Things were lost. "The Court gave out industrious Strangers lost but a Trifle, and therefore almost the Whole. This is done great Clamour of the Factory, who not having a Custom-House built according to his Majesty's Promise after the Earthquake, and for which Cent was levied on all Goods imported amounts to a Sum sufficient considerably larger than was necessary.

Extract of a Letter from a Gentleman, lately arrived whose Authority we can rely on, informs there are now on the Western Coast 100 Sail of large French Boats fishing for each Vessel carrying 30 or 40 Men, of Nets which extends upwards of 3 Miles, must greatly prejudice our Fisheries, and the Shoals of Fish when coming in, are detained in deep Water, which will come at the usual Time to the feed near the Shore, and will consequently Scarcity of Hake, Cod, and Ling, in for taking them. Last Summer there of these large Boats fishing on this Coast which made two Trips to France, fully Mackerel, which has occasioned so great that large Orders to this City for Mackerel Winter could not be executed.
