But now his Troubles are all concluded, and what will be the Consequence of his Fate, is neither known, nor can be easily conjectured.

Aug. 28. The Right Hon. Mr. Legge, being told by a Noble Friend, within a Day or two of his Death, that he seemed much Better, answered with great Vivacity and Spirit, "Oh, no, its all over with me; I am going, as fast as possible, to join the Majority."

Aug. 30. Yesterday died, aged near 80, that great and worthy Patriot, Sir John Barnard, Knt.

September 4. By the French Mail there is Advice, that two Houses at Havre, three at Dunkirk, two at Rochelle, one at Bbologn, and one at St. Valery, from whence most of the English and Scotch Smugglers have heretofore been furnished with the Manufactures and Goods of that Kingdom, were finally shut up in the Month of August last. It is added, that the late Dispositions to prevent Smuggling in the Isle of Man, put the last Hand to their Dissolution.

A Piece of Scotch Cambric, fabricated in Glasgow, has lately been brought to Town to be laid before the Society for the Encouragement of Arts, and it is thought by good Judges to be equal to the finest of that Manufacture ever imported from a neighbouring Kingdom.

By another Letter from the same Place, of the 10th ult. we learn, that a Company of Sixty Volunteers, from Maryland, had arrived there, in order to join our Army.

Since our last arrived here the Ship Hero, Captain Forster, from Holland, with 700 Germans, all in good Health, having had a most extraordinary Passage of only Thirty Days from the Isle of Wight.
