We hear three Companies of Foot will embark the latter End of this Month for Newfoundland.

The very unequal Distribution of Prize Money in the Royal Navy, we are informed, has for fome Days past been under the Consideration of an honourable Board; and it is now faid, that exclufive of a moderate monthly Augmentation of Seamens Wages, it has also been proposed, for the greater Encouragement of that useful Body of Men, the common Sailors, that full one Pourth of the Prize Money may be fet apart for the use of the Poremastmen, in all future Captures.

Sept. 22. Letters from Senegal mention, that Advice has been received there from Governor Debatt, of Gambia, that a French Frigate, of 36 Guns, double manned, with the Governor of Goree on board, was come into the River Gambia; that the French behaved with great Infolence, telling the English they were determined to force a Trade in that River; and that they had entirely prevented Governor Debatt from receiving fresh Provisions.

Seit 25. A Person of a scheming Turn, has a Plan to lay before the Government, whereby he propotes a faving of 50,000l. Sterling annually,

without any new Taxes. On Monday last, a Couple that had been outasked at Marybone Church, went thither to be married. As the Rev. Mr. Boo: was reading the Ceremony, when he came to the Words, Will than bave this Man to be thy wedded Husband? The Woman answered, No. And upon the Minister's asking the Reason, she said, I bave told bim several Times I would not marry bim. The Clergyman then asked her, Wby she came to the Church? she replied, I came to tell You I will not marry bim; and immediately went away with two Men who came to attend the Ceremony, leaving the Difappointed undegroom at Church. [In the Lurch.]

Letters from Lifbon of the 29th ult. bring Advice, that his most Faithful Majesty has not only approved and confirmed all the military Regulati on made by Count de Lippe, but has heaped also immense Riches and other extraordinary Favours on that Nobleman; which has occasioned some of the Portuguese Nobility to look on the Count with a jealous Eye.

We hear that some very extraordinary Dispatches were Yesterday received in regard to the Behaviour of the French at Newfoundland.

Sept. 27. The Poliscript of a Letter from Warfaw, dated September 3, runs thus, " Some Advices already bring, that the Election of a King was actually made on the 7th, and that Count Stanislaus Poniatowski re-united all Voices in his

Two Couriers arrived at Berlin, on the 15th Inst. with the important News, that the Election of a King of Poland was happily accomplished on the 7th of this Month at Warlaw, in the Person of Count Poniatowski, Grand Butler of Lithuania; and that he had been proclaimed, under the Name of Stantilaus Augustus, King of Poland, and Grand Duke of Lithuania. This Election was carried on with an Unanimity unknown hitherto in the Annals of Poland.

Olloher 2. They write from Berlin, that extraordinary military Preparations are making throughout the Prussian Dominions; but the Motive was not known.

It is faid there have, for some Days past, been the greatest Appearance for a perfect Unity and coalition of Parties, that has been experienced for some Years.

We are informed, that an express was last Sunday Morning fent off from Plymouth to Newfoundland.

They write from Lisbon, that the Court of Madrid, no longer able to behold with a placid Eye she great naval and military Preparations of his Most Faithful Majesty, and the perfect Unanimity at present subsisting between that Kingdom and Great-Britain, have at last begun to manifest their Jealoufy in fomething more than Words, as undoubted Intelligence some Time past the Spaniards have been marching feveral Regiments from the interior Provinces especially from those of Arragon and Castile, with Intent to form an Army of Observation on the Side of Portugal; and that large Quantities of heavy Artillery were daily arriving on the Fron-

NEWPORT, November 8.

On Monday Night, the 29th ult. the Store of

Mefficurs John and James Morion, in Thamesfireet, was broke open, and fundry Sorts of valuable Goods to a considerable Amount, were stolen. The next Day, Search being made by a proper Officer, the Goods were found at the Lodgings of a Person who calls himself James Stanners; and, being strongly suspected to be the Villain, was apprehended, and carried before Martin Howard, Biq; but positively denied his committing the Fact, or having any Knowledge of the Goods, though found wrapped up in his Cloathing, and under his Bed. However, he was at length perfuaded to confess himself. Guilty, and that no other Person was concerned with him, and was thereupon committed to Goal. The Manner in which he effected this Piece of Villainy, was by cutting Hole through the Door, and thereby was enabled to lift up the Bar which secured it. On interrogating him, he informed, that he commanded a Brig from Liverpool, which he lost near Cape Fear, on the Coast of North-Carolina, on his Passage from Jamaica to Liverpool; that he travelled from Philadelphia to this Town by Land, and had refided here near a Month.

Nov. 12. On Friday, the 12th ult. arrived at Cape-Fear, from London, the Hon. Col. Tryan, lately appointed Lieutenant-Governor of North-Carolina.

NEW-YORK, November 22.

Sunday was committed to Goal (by Francis Filkin, Efq; Alderman of the South Ward in this City) one William Jackson, charged before said Alderman with privately Stealing out of the Dwelling House of Martin Kreuder, of German Town, near Philadelphia, A Silver Watch, five French Crowns, a Guinea and Half, besides other Money and Effects, the Property of a German (or Dutch) Minister, who boarded in the said Kreuder's House.

On Monday Night last, an Officer arrived Expreis from the Army to the Northward, from whence we have received Advices, that Colonel Bradstreet had broke up his Camp at Sandusky, on the 18th of October; having first engaged many of the upper Nations, with whom Peace had been concluded, to declare against the Shawanese and Delawares, and to fend Parties out to War against them. That about Seventy Miles from Sandusky, the Lake rose in the Night on a sudden, and the Surf beat with such Violence on the Shore, where the Army had landed, that betwixt Twenty and Thirty Boats were beat to Pieces, notwithstanding the Efforts made to fave them: The Night was very dark, and little else than the small Quantity of Provisions that was in them could be faved The Army proceeded to the Grand River, about 70 Miles farther, which they entered in a Storm: The tempestuous Weather having the Appearance of continuing, and the Boats being deeply laden, by receiving the additional Men from the Boats which were loft, a Number of the best Marchers marched along the Lake Side, and the Indians took to the Woods.—The Men who marched, were for a Time relieved by other Men from the Boats; but Provisions being out, and a Snow-Storm upon the Lake, about Two Hundred Men pushed on for Fort Erie, in which they suffered greatly, and would have suffered more, had not the most advanced been relieved with Provisions and Boats, from Fort Erie, in Consequence of Colonel Bradstreet's Directions, sent by Express. The Remainder, except a few Miffing, were taken up by the Boats on the 2d Instant, and the Army arrived at Niagara; from whence, the Regular Troops, and some Provincials, sailed in the Vesfels on the 9th Inftant; the Reft of the Army being left to follow in Boats under Lieut. Colonel Putnam. The Vessels arrived at Oswego on the 1 1th Instant, in a great Storm, in which the Snow Johnson was loft, going into the Oswego River;
By this Accident, some Baggage and Arma were
loft, but the Men are happily saved.

W. and laid her Hatches in the Water, which made me heave over 4 of the Lee Guns, and was cutting away the Mizen maft, but the Wind blew it away 14 feet above the Deck, tho' the Mizen Topfail Yard was on Deck, and the Topmail Bruck, The Main mall was forung in two Places; the Sloop not righting nor veering; obliged us to cut away the Main man; the then wore, and made good Weather.
