By the French Mail there is Advice, that the repeated Captures of so many valuable Merchant Ships, by the Barbary Rovers, have, at length, determined the Ministry to proceed against them with the utmost Rigour; and all the Ships now appointed on this Expedition are furnished with Oars, and are of the most swift sailing Construction that can be picked out.

In Reward for his Dexterity, the young Lady enquired his Name, made him a handsome Present at that Time, sent for him on Friday following, and married him with a special Licence on Sunday. NEW-YORK, December 6.

Last Night arrived the Brig Bumper, Captain Duncan Brown, from Ivica, in the Mediterranean, last from Newfoundland. We have Advice, that the Algerines have taken many Vessels under English Colours, and with English Passes, belonging to other Nations; and that the Persons who have granted those Passes will be called to Account for it in England. At Naples, the Plague succeeded the same, and carried off great Numbers. A large ship that went from Virginia, loaded with Wheat, was arrived there from Dublin, her Cargo much damaged.
