

**ANNAPOLIS, April 11.**  
Last Thursday we mentioned the Arrival of the *Yan*, Capt. *Coulson*, from *London*, in *Patawack*. Next Day the Letters by him were brought to Town. With Capt. *Coulson* came Passenger Mr. *CHARLES DICCI*, Merchant, of *Prince-George's* County.

The Capt. *Hawrick*, *Lake*, *Errington*, and *Carri* for this Province, were to sail in a few Days after the *Yan*.

Extract of a Letter from *London*, Jan. 19, 1765.  
"Bank Stock is now at 127½, the Bank having declared a Dividend of 15 per Cent in the Place of 44: Before this, Stock was at 112. This has been a lucky Incident for your Paper Money. The Directors have gained great Honour by their Conduct. When they found they could divide 5 per Cent for 5 Years to come, they Lock'd the Doors, that no one should go out, sent off immediately Expresses to *Holland*, *Hamburg*, &c. and gave Notice to all the Coffee Houses, and to the Exchange, so that every Body knew of the Dividend to be made before a Shilling could be Bought or Sold. This Transaction hath raised our Credit Abroad exceedingly, and all our Stocks are creeping up as fast, as so heavy a Body can move."

"The Minority is reduced to nothing. Pitt's bad Health has quite Disabled him."  
The WHALE we mentioned last Week, was kill'd in *Chester-River*, about a Mile below *Queen's-Town*, and measur'd in Length 41 Feet odd Inches, and about 18 or 20 Feet in Circumference, of the Bone Sort, and is supposed to have followed a Brig, which went up *Chester*.

Yesterday the Provincial Court was Adjourn'd to Tuesday the 16th Day of July next; the Small-Pox being yet Rife in Town.  
No one Person has yet Died in Town by Inoculation for the Small-Pox; But, last Saturday Mr. *GEORGE NEWMAN*, a young Man of an honest Character, who was Inoculated in Town, and removed about Two Miles out of Town, for the Benefit of Nursing, Died of that Distemper, having been very ill most of the Winter, and at the Time of his Inoculation in a bad State of Health. His Body was Decently Interr'd on Monday last in our Church Yard, and attended by a considerable Number of the Fraternity of Free-Masons (of which he was a Member) properly Cloath'd, agreeable to the Request in his Will.

No Body has the Small-Pox, nor is any one liable to it, in *Charles-Street*, except a little Boy in a Family at a considerable Distance from the Printing-Office.

As they all went off in a new Boat of about 17 Feet Keel, whose upper Works are painted red, and her Sides laid over with Turpentine, it is probable they will endeavour to get on board of some Ship, and will try to pass for Freeman, or perhaps will steer as far as they can to the Southward.
