ANTIGUA, March 27. Extra of a Letter from Dominica, dated the 16th Instant.

"We are here under the greatest Conternation and Terror on account of the many and violent Earthquakes felt here of late; all Yesterday and last Night, without any long Intermission, the Shocks were more violent than were ever known in the Island before. It is dreaded some fatal Issue will soon follow: Once or twice in particular Yesterday, the Motion of the Earth, with a strong hollow Sound, was so sensible, that we all feared the Houses in both Towns would have fallen down, and that the Earth would have opened; no other Mischief happened besides a general Panic in all the Inhabitants.

NEW-YORK, April 25. We have been favoured with an Account of many Circumstances relating to the passing the Stamp Bill in the House of Commons, but it came to Hand too late for this Week's Paper. By this Account we find the Matter has been greatly misrepresented in all our Papers, copied from the Boston Papers. The Bill having been most strenuously opposed by many excellent Speakers in the House, where it passed but by a small Majority, and contrary to the general Sense of the People in England.

We hear that an eminent Lawyer, not less admired for his Abilities than esteemed for his Integrity, took Occasion in a late interesting Debate in a certain august Assembly, to express himself in the following Terms: For my own Part, I think it far better to fall with the Laws, than to rise upon the Ruins of them. CATO could not have thought more nobly, nor CICERO have expressed himself with greater Force and Elegance.

Extra of a Letter from London, dated Jan. 24. "There is a great Talk at the other End of the Town about the Alteration of Governments to be made the next Session of Parliament, in the Northern District of America: It is said there will be but Four, viz. Nova-Scotia, Province of Main, New-Hampshire, and New-York. The Massachusetts, Rhode-Island, and Connecticut, to be divided between New-York and New-Hampshire."
