

but with Submission to your Lordship's better Judgment, I think, from the Nature of our territorial Rights such a Regulation might have come with much more Propriety from the King, who is Supreme Lord of these Dominions, than from the Parliament, and then the Concurrence of the Colonies would have been of Course given thereto. LONDON, March 5. WE hear that the Estimate delivered in to the Board of Works for erecting a Scaffold in Westminster-hall for the Trial of Lord Byron, amounts to 7500l.

The usual Fee to the Lord High Steward on these Occasions for his Table and Equipage is 1000l. a Day.

March 11. We hear, the Government have at last ended the Affair of the Isle of Man, and agreed with the Proprietor of that Island, for a total Cession of the Customs, Duties, &c. The Compensation granted, we hear, is the same formerly mentioned in the Papers, viz. 70,000l. by a Parliamentary Grant, and 2000l. per Annum, during the Life of the Proprietor and his Lady.

The 70,000l. above mentioned, we hear, was agreed to in the House of Commons, on Wednesday last.

March 22. The grand Council held last Tuesday at the Cockpit, Whitehall, related entirely to American Affairs, and to take into Consideration certain extraordinary Petitions lately sent over from that Continent.

JAMAICA, March 16.

Tuesday last a Cause of great Expectation came on in the Supreme Court of Judicature, upon an Action of Damages against a Gentleman for Non-performance of a Promise of Marriage made to a young Lady; the Trial lasted until 6 o'Clock in the Evening, when the Jury withdrew, who having taken up some Time in considering the Evidence, returned their Verdict sealed up, and on the next Morning it was published, by which the Jury gave the Plaintiff 3400l. Damages, with Costs of Suit.

We hear the Damages have been since paid.

Capt. Appowen, on his Passage from Falmouth, spoke with the Brig Polly, Capt. Craig, in Lat. 31° 30' Long. 61° from Maryland for St. Christophers, all well on board.
