To the Printer of the Westminster Journal.

S I R,

AS it is said, that in the Bill which is soon to be brought into the House, for the better paying and regulating the Army in his Majesty's American Dominions, there is to be a Clause, that Soldiers may be Billeted, or Quartered, upon private Families, I should take it as a Favour, if any of your ingenious Correspondents would answer the following Questions. 1. Whether the Subjects of the Crown of Great-Britain, in whatsoever Part of its Dominions they may be settled, are not to be esteemed a free People, and treated as such? 2. Whether they are not entitled to, and ought to enjoy, all the essential Rights of Englishmen? 3. Whether an Englishman forfeits all his Rights, and is no more a Freeman, when he goes abroad and settles in some of the Colonies of this Kingdom? 4. Whether such People are, or can by any Means be deemed free, who are subject to have Soldiers Quartered upon them at Pleasure? 5. Whether the Passing a Law for Quartering Soldiers on private Families in our Plantations abroad, will not be a large Stride towards enslaving us in the same Manner at home? 6. And whether our tamely submitting to fix Shackles on our Fellow-Subjects in America, would not shew that we Ourselves were ripe for the same in England?

Whoever takes up the said Servant and Negro, and secures them so as their Master may have them again, shall have Twenty Shillings Reward for each, beside what the Law allows, paid by the Subscriber, living near the North-East Forge, in Cecil County.
