We hear from Hartford in Connecticut, that on Friday last the following tragical Accident happen'd at that Place. On hearing the joyful News of the Repeal of the Stamp-Act, about 3 half Barrels of Powder were provided, and lodged in the lower Room of a Brick School House in the Town, where, after taking out 16 or 18 Pounds, it was lock'd up, and a Number of Gentlemen and others, affembled in the upper Room, and with the Powder that had been taken out, were preparing Cartridges, Sky Rockets and other Fire Works, intended for the Rejoicings that Evening. While they were thus employ'd, a Negro Boy, feeing fome Powder featter'd on the Ground, feraped fome of it together, and fet Fire to it. This by some Means or other communicated with the Powder in the Room below, which went off with a terrible Explosion, tore the House to Pieces, feattering Part of it in the Air, and reducing the rest to a Heap of Ruins. The Number of Perfons in the upper Room, when the Accident happened, was 22, two of those were supposed to be driven thro' the Windows into the Air, and were thrown a considerable Distance from the House, but are likely to recover—all the rest who were buried in the Ruins of the House, were more truised and hurt; several had their Bones broken
