It was really affecting to fee them congratulate each other, wherever they met, and to hear them incessantly say to one another, It is then true that we have e Bishop; GOD hath taken Pity of us: And to see them afterwards run in Crowds to the Parish Church to see this Bishop, whom they look upon as the Support of their Religion, and as a Pledge of the King's paternal Goodness to them. In Fact, at the same Time that they publicly bless the Lord for having given them a Bishop, they loudly proclaim their Gratitude to his Majefly for having attended to their Request: It is likely that this Favour conferred on the Canadians by the King, will effectually attach them to the British Government. It is also very pleasing to them, to have received on this Occasion the gratulations of several Persons of Note of our Nation, who indeed seemed to partake of their Joy. And we doubt not but that the Cardians, who appear to be very susceptible of Gratitude, will by those Means become more firmly united to us.
