liament to America in general, in the opening Free Ports at the Islands of Jamaica and Dominica; yet, at the same Time, they cannot but lament, that it is their Unhappiness to be in no Condition to reap the Benefits which, it was imagined, would flow from so wise a Policy; that the collecting great Quantities of the Produce of Martinico, Guadaloupe, &c. at the Island of Dominica, will be the natural Consequence of opening that Port, and would prove of real Importance to those Co lonies, were they at Liberty to bring them back in Return for their Lumber and Provisions; but as they are now prohibited from taking any Thing, except Molasses, and, it is justly apprehended there cannot be a sufficient Quantity of that Commodity to support any considerable Trade, the Petitioners think it evident, that no substantial Advantage can be derived to them under fuch a Restraint; that they are, at the same Time, at a Loss to discern the Principle on which the Prohibition is founded; for, fince Sugar may be imported direct from the Foreign Islands, it feems much more reasonable, to suffer it from a Free Port belonging to Great-Britain; that the Petiti-oners therefore humbly hope, that the House will think it equitable to adapt this Trade to their Circumstances, by granting them Liberty to import into the Colonies all West-India Productions, in Exchange for their Commodities; and that, upon the Whole, with the greatest Anxiety, the Petitioners find themselves obliged to inform the House, that, although, at the last Session, the Necessity of relieving the Trade of those Colonies seems to have been universally admitted, and the tender Regard of Parliament for their Happiness highly distinguished, nevertheless, Experience has evinced, that the Commercial Regulations, then enacted, instead of remedying, have increased the heavy Burthen under which it already laboured; as, therefore, upon due Consideration, it will be manifest, that the Ability of those Colonies, to purchase the Manufactures of Great-Britain, immediately depends upon, and is inseparably connected with, the Progress of their Commerce; and as that Ability only by removing the Necessity of Home Manufactures, will leave them at Liberty to pursue Agriculture, in which their true Interest consists; therefore praying the House to take the several Matters, in the said Petition suggested, into their Consideration, and to grant such Relief therein as shall be thought consistent with good Policy, and the mutual Interests of Great-Britain and her Colonies.

House of Lords. This having been a Case of great Expectation, and long contested, we have, to gratify our Readers, obtained an Extract of a Letter upon this Subject, wrote by a Gentleman of Distinction in London, to his Correspondent in this Town, which is as follows.

Landon, February 10, 1767. SIR. SHOULD have acknowledged the Receip of your Favours October 14 past sooner, but that my Time and Mind have been fully employed for Months past, in a Public Affair, which most nearly concerned the Civil and Religious Interests of every Diffenter in England. By the Force of Truth, which is always an Overmatch for Cunning, and by the Grace of God, supporting at this Time, by his Providence, that glorious Cause, we found the whole House of Lords, as it were, born in a Day to countenance, and also to give Judg-ment as one Man, in Favour of the Diffenter, against that great Power the City of London, and all that Art we have contested with in the Sheriff; Caule for more than Fourteen Years; and even in this last fignal Defeat, to use their own Expression, they died very hard. When the Council on both Sides had done, and the Judges who were fummoned to attend had given their Opinions feriating on a Point of Law which was started, my Lord Mansfield, in a most nervous and eloquent Speech, amongst other Things declared, That the Mode of religious Worship amongst Protestant Dissenters, was established by Law. And surther, That according to his Apprehension, it would be Sin in a conscientious Dissenter to conform to the Church of England. He concluded, by moving the Hode, that the Judgment be affirmed, which the House agreed to immediately.
