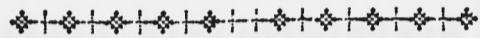


paying it, at the End of the Term; and in the mean Time made a GENERAL LEGAL TENDER. The Experience of now near Half a Century in the Middle Colonies; has convinced them of it among themselves; by the great Increase of their Settlements, Numbers, Buildings, Improvements, Agriculture, Shipping and Commerce. And the same Experience has satisfied the British Merchants who Trade thither, that it has been greatly useful to them, and not in a single Instance prejudicial.

It is therefore hoped, that securing the full Discharge of British Debts; which are payable here, and in all Justice and Reason ought to be fully discharged here in Sterling Money, the Restraint on the legal Tender within the Colonies will be taken off, at least for those Colonies that desire it, and where the Merchants trading to them make no Objection to it.

LEGHORN, March 6.

THE 19th of last Month arrived in this Port, a Felucca, carrying the Neapolitan Flag, and commanded by Captain Aniello-Manzo d'Ischia, which lately sailed from hence with Merchandize for Sardinia. This Ship having been forced by bad Weather to put into the Isle of Capraia, and having thrown out her Anchor there, she immediately received from the Fortrefs several Vollsies of Cannon, which shattered her Sails, and damaged the Ship. The Captain immediately hoisted the Neapolitan Flag, but they did not cease firing at him, so that he was forced to cut his Cables and put to Sea. Two of his Sailors are received into the Hospital of St. Anthony, being mortally wounded. He did not know of the Corsicans having lately debarked a Body of Troops in that Island, and besieged the Fortrefs.

Hamburg, March 27. By Advices just received from Polish Prussia, we learn, that a Body of Russian Troops is arrived at Thorn; but it is not said whether it will go farther, or remain there to protect the Assembly of the Deputies of the Dissidents, who propose to meet there, and enter into a strict Confederacy.

Genoa, March 28. Two Tripoline Zebbeck Cruizers have turned Pirates, and committed several Acts of Piracy: They have killed Five French Sailors they found on board a Vessel at Anchor in the Morea, and obliged the Master of an English Ship, called the Liberty, to give 100 Zequins for the Release of his Vessel.

Hamburg, March 31. The last Letters from Thorn, Elbing, and other Places in Royal Prussia, bring the important News, that the Dissidents of that Province, as well as those of Littles and Great Poland, had, after several Deliberations, agreed to enter into a Confederacy at Thorn, and had unanimously elected Lieutenant General de Goltz their Marshal. In Consequence of this Union, the Dissidents all signed a Manifesto, which they caused to be printed, setting forth their Motives for taking such a Step.

The Magistrates of Thorn, Elbing, and Dantzick, have entered into this Confederacy.

LONDON, April 4.

We are assured that Commodore Wallace, in the Dolphin Man of War, is not only to further the Discoveries made by Commodore Byron, but is to continue his Course up the South-Seas and the Pacific Ocean, in order to attempt a N. E. Passage by Hudson's Bay. He is not expected to return till the Year 1770.

They write from Gibraltar, that Governor Irwin having been informed by Letter, that Twenty-three Englishmen were forcibly detained on board a Dutch Ship of War in the Bay, had sent an Officer to the Captain, demanding their being immediately delivered up, which was accordingly done.

April 8. By Letters from Cornwall we learn, that there is horrible Distress in that Country, Corn not only very dear, but hardly to be got for Money. Thousands of Tinnets quite unemployed; most of the great Mines left off working. Some Corn has been taken by force, paying their own Price for it, in Truro Market.
