The following Act, passed last Session, Request of several of our Clergy

An ACT to oblige Infected Ships, Vessels, coming into this Province, to quarantine.

WHEREAS great Mortality has arisen from the late Small-Pox, and Passengers from other Vessels coming into this Province with Servants, by communicating to the Inhabitants, dangerous tempers, begun at first by Numbers closely confined together for long Time

Space: Be it therefore Enacted, by the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary, by and with the Advice and Consent of his Lordship's Governor, and the Honourable the House of Assembly, and the Authority of the said Lord Proprietary, that no Ship or Vessel whatsoever, coming into this Province after the First Day of May next, shall be impo

Thirty Servants or Passengers, shall make her Entry, or land or put on board any Goods, Passenger, or Servant, before she shall have together with Two other credible Persons, who shall make Oath before the Collector, or other Officer, that neither the Small-Pox, Jail-Fever, Flux, or any such dangerous Distemper, is, or hath been on board of such Ship or Vessel, on her Passage, to the Belief of such Captain, or other Officer, who shall take such Oath respectively. Which Oath the Collector, or Naval Officer, is hereby directed, personally, or by some other Person, to administer, and a Certificate thereof to be made out for Fee or Reward.

And be it further Enacted, That in any Ship or Vessel shall be offered to land, such Oath shall be refused to be made, unless the Space of Forty-eight Hours shall have elapsed since the Arrival of the Officer, to whom Application is made for Entry as aforesaid, shall have been enjoined and strictly required to be made, upon, to transmitt and send a full and true Account and Information thereof, to the Commander in Chief of this Province: And, on such Information being received, such Ship or Vessel shall be taken into Quarantine in such Place or Places as shall be appointed by the Commander in Chief of this Province, and in such Manner, as from Time to Time, and in such Manner, as from Time to Time, shall be directed by the Commander in Chief of this Province: and, that during the Time being; and, that during the Time being; until the said Ship or Vessel shall be cleared from such Quarantine, no Person, nor Goods imported therein, shall come on shore, or go on board any other Ship or Vessel in this Province, nor shall any Person, nor Goods imported therein, be taken into Quarantine, without Licence first obtained from the Governor or Commander in Chief of this Province, in such Manner, and under such Limitations and Restrictions as he shall think fit to grant or allow the same: And, that no Person shall be allowed to go on shore, or to be recovered, with full Power of Action of Debt, Bill of Indictment, or other Proceedings, wherein no Effoin, Protest, or other Proceedings, shall be allowed; and if a Servant or Slave, who shall be taken into Quarantine, shall be found guilty of any Breach of the said Oath, the Master, Commander, or Person having the Charge of such Ship or Vessel, shall be liable to the same without such Licence as aforesaid, and shall forfeit and pay One Hundred Pounds, to be recovered, with full Power of Action of Debt, Bill of Indictment, or other Proceedings, wherein no Effoin, Protest, or other Proceedings, shall be allowed; and if a Servant or Slave, who shall be taken into Quarantine, shall be found guilty of any Breach of the said Oath, the Master, Commander, or Person having the Charge of such Ship or Vessel, shall be liable to the same without such Licence as aforesaid, and shall forfeit and pay One Hundred Pounds, to be recovered, with full Power of Action of Debt, Bill of Indictment, or other Proceedings, wherein no Effoin, Protest, or other Proceedings, shall be allowed; and if a Servant or Slave, who shall be taken into Quarantine, shall be found guilty of any Breach of the said Oath, the Master, Commander, or Person having the Charge of such Ship or Vessel, shall be liable to the same without such Licence as aforesaid, and shall forfeit and pay One Hundred Pounds, to be recovered, with full Power of Action of Debt, Bill of Indictment, or other Proceedings, wherein no Effoin, Protest, or other Proceedings, shall be allowed; 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
