It is confidently reported that near Thirty People in this Family, among whom the worthy Lady herself was included, fell Victims to the Fury of this malignant ravaging Pestilence. Its Progress was rapid, and its Virulence too powerful for all the Skill and Affiduity of our ablest Physicians; it did its Rage intermit, 'til, by a *Waste* of Lives, it wanted Subjects to prey upon.— That aggravated the afflicting Circumstances of this unhappy Family, was a total Suspension of those tender Offices which this much respected Lady might have expected from a humane Neighbourhood. They could only hold, with heart-felt Sympathy, a Distress which they could not attempt to relieve with the utmost Hazard of their own Lives. The Case of Mr. HOWARD, near ANNAPOLIS, who lost his own Life, and many of his Family, is a recent and notorious Instance of the malignity of this Distemper.— Moved by tender Concern for the Inhabitants, who were too often felt the direful Rage of this de-waiting Contagion, our Assembly, at its last Meeting, enacted a Quarantine Law, which will probably give some Check to its Introduction, and save the Lives of thousands. It is to be wish'd that the People cherish an Act, so manifestly tending to the Preservation of their Lives, their Health, and their Property, and that they will take every Measure in their Power, to forward the execution of it, and to obviate every Evanescent which the Arts of interested Men can devise to frustrate its Operation, and prevent the beneficial Purpose of our Legislature.
